FIRST COME FIRST SERVE.

Here are the details if you missed them:

Taking place in Moscrop library from <u>12:00 pm to 3:30 pm – students MUST attend both days</u>. This course is open to all students from Grades 8-12. Please note, this is a certificate issued by the local Health Authority. To be successful, students need to achieve 70% on an exam with 50 multiple choice questions. This is a closed book exam with a time allotment of 1 hour. Students will need sufficient reading and comprehension skills to be successful in this course. For example, students should be earning (or have earned) a minimum standing of Developing in a regular Grade 8 Science course. The cost for the course is **\$50.00** (*includes instruction, workbook, and certificate from the Fraser Health Authority*). Permission forms may be picked up outside room 329 or room 323. Bring your permission form and the receipt of payment or reference # to Room 329. Forms/receipts can be given to any Home Ec. teacher in Room 329.

Food Safe certification is highly sought by employers throughout Western Canada. It is designed to teach food handlers about the causes and prevention of food-borne illnesses. Due to the serious consequences of food-borne outbreaks, many employers in the food service industry are requiring their staff to take the Food Safe program. Many employers now insist you have this training before applying for a job. Students receive a certificate upon successful completion of the course. *Moscrop Home Economics Department*


