HPV IMMUNIZATIONS: Fraser Health is offering Human Papillomavirus (HPV) immunization at all schools in our region to all eligible students in grade6-12 during the 2024/25 school year. Students were mailed letters/consent forms home and are instructed to <u>bring their signed forms on day of the clinic</u>.

Our school's clinic will be held on Tuesday March 4 and Tuesday April 1.

HPV immunization protects against several cancers and works best when given in early adolescence. Getting immunized prepares the immune system to prevent infection.


