HAPPY PRIDE WEEK MOSCROP! Come out to the rainbow crosswalk at the beginning of lunch today (Monday) to see a pride dance performance by dance leadership while the Pride flag is raised over our school as a symbol of Moscrop's support for and celebration of LGBTQIA+ students and staff. Look for the Pride flag posters around the school all week to learn more about various queer identities and be entered in a draw to win prizes! – *Ms. Green*



Did you know that:

- the rainbow pride flag, originally created in 1979 is an emblem of celebration and empowerment for the queer community. In 2018, the new progress flag was created adding the pink and blue stripes of the transgender flag and the brown and black stripes to represent queer people of color.
- Vancouver and Montreal were the first Canadian cities to host an official Pride march and festival in 1979? Don't miss out on celebrating this year. The Burnaby Pride Festival will take place at Civic Square Metrotown On July 26.
- the term "two-spirit" was first coined at the Third Annual Inter-tribal Native American, First Nations, Gay and Lesbian American Conference in Winnipeg in 1990. Two-Spirit refers to a person who embodies both a masculine and feminine spirit. Indigenous languages have many words and expressions for people we would now call Two-Spirit. Cree contains at least six!
- as of 2018, BC residents can legally be recognized as non-binary in their gender identity. This was a significant legal achievement for people who identify as non-binary or genderqueer. In place of a F or M on their driver's license, non-binary people can place an x.
- same sex marriage became legal in BC in 2003. In that same year, Michael Leshner and Michael Stark became Canada's first legally married gay couple. The 2016 census reported that over 24,000 married couples in Canada were homosexuals.
