Within Catchment area /Outside Burnaby

 If currently living within the catchment area for Moscrop's French Immersion Program, but attending a French Immersion school outside of Burnaby, an Out-of-District application must be completed and received at Moscrop between February 1-28, 2018

Outside Catchment area (within Burnaby)

 For those living outside of Moscrop's French Immersion catchment, Cross District Transfer Application must be received at Moscrop between February 1-28, 2018
