### NEW! PLASTIC BAG FACTS: DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that disposable plastic bags are used for an average of 12 minutes? It takes **500 (or more) years for a plastic bag to degrade in a landfill**. They also never totally 'breakdown' - instead they photo-degrade, becoming microplastics that absorb toxins and continue to pollute the environment. These microplastics often end up in our oceans.

### **Consider instead:**

- Reusing your disposable plastic shopping bags multiple times by washing them out
- Using compostable plastic bags for liners in your garbage cans
- Not using garbage liners at all, since we have compost for much of our 'wet garbage' and then you won't collect plastic bags
- Using cloth and reusable bags. They are small and can fit in a purse or small bag

Did you know that disposable plastic bags are used for an average of 12 minutes? It takes **500 (or more) years for a plastic bag to degrade in a landfill**. They also never totally 'breakdown' - instead they photo-degrade, becoming microplastics that absorb toxins and continue to pollute the environment. These microplastics often end up in our oceans.

# Consider instead:

- Reusing your disposable plastic shopping bags multiple times by washing them out
