TO GRADE 11 AND 12 STUDENTS AND PARENTS: Current Career Preparation 80-hour students in grade 11 and 12 are reminded to be watching Microsoft Teams Class – various opportunities to volunteer have recently been posted – both in person and some virtual opportunities.
