It's common knowledge that the sport of lacrosse was invented by Indigenous Peoples – but did you know that the roots of the sport of hockey may also have roots in First Peoples community games? The origins of hockey are hotly contested – claims of “inventing the sport” exist in Europe, Montreal, Kingston, NWT and Nova Scotia. 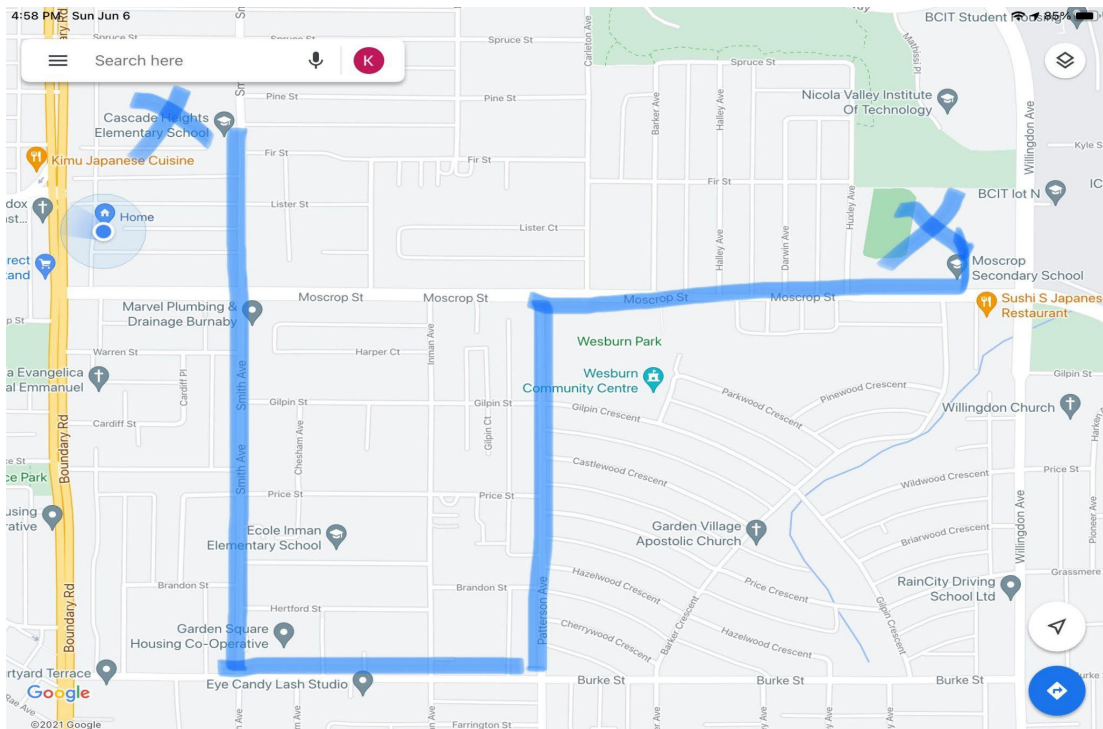
