- Iron workers must be able to lift 50 pounds and be comfortable working at heights
- Mechanical Insulators insulating pipes, boilers, air condition units etc be comfortable with working in some small spaces
- Radio tower installer must be comfortable with working at heights
- Carpentry-Youth Train in Trades get your foundation training in Carpentry paid for by Burnaby School District, you pay for your own safety gear, and textbook, and hand tools, we pay for the tuition. Huge demand for carpenters. Grade 12 students graduating in June are eligible to take a 6th. Year of studies in any of our programs delivered in Burnaby Schools.

Youth Apprenticeship Program – Burnaby Students up to the age of 19 can contact Ms. Wispinski – and if they are working in a TRADE, get signed as a Youth Apprenticeship and qualify for Ministry of Education Youth Apprenticeship Award of \$1000. This program has been created as an incentive to get youth to enter into trades, as they are in high demand – and lead to excellent career pathways.


