GENERAL

FOOD SAFE LEVEL 1: is being offered at Moscrop in the **library from 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm on May 31st & June 1st as an in-school field trip** – students **MUST attend both days**. This course is open to all students from **Grades 8-12**. Please note, this is a certificate issued by the local Health Authority. To be successful, students need to achieve 70% on an exam with 50 multiple choice questions. This is a closed book exam with a time allotment of 1 hour. Students will need sufficient reading and comprehension skills to be successful in this course. For example, students should be earning (or have earned) a grade of C+ in a regular Grade 8 science course. The cost for the course is \$50.00 (includes instruction, workbook, and certificate from the Fraser Health Authority). This fee is payable in cash or cheque (made out to Moscrop Secondary School) or through the School Cash Online system. **Payment is accepted at the main office or online from April 7th – April 13th. The first 25 payments received will secure a spot on the course list**. Permission forms may be picked up outside **room 329 on April 3rd at lunch**. **Bring permission form and the receipt of payment to Room 329. Forms/receipts can be given to any Home Ec. teacher in Room 329. Space in the course is limited to only 25 students – please sign up quickly to ensure your spot!**

Food Safe certification is highly sought by employers throughout Western Canada. It is designed to teach food handlers about the causes and prevention of food-borne illnesses. Due to the serious consequences of food-borne outbreaks, many employers in the food service industry are requiring their staff to take the Food Safe program. Many employers now insist you have this training before applying for a job. Students receive a certificate upon successful completion of the course.

Workplace injuries and illnesses claimed the lives of 181 B.C. workers last year, with more than half (107) of the work-related deaths the result of occupational disease — 67 were the result of exposure to asbestos, with many exposures happening decades earlier.

Every injury, disease, or death serves as a powerful reminder that employers have an important responsibility to ensure that all workplaces in B.C. are healthy and safe.
